Dear Members of the Class of 1945.

On June 5, 1945, General Omar Bradley stood before your graduating class - 852 strong – and, as you prepared to assume the mantle of leadership as the United States Army's newest officers, charged you to do so with "...a sense of duty and the will to succeed ... to live in honor and with devotion to your country."

Like so many graduates who came before you and so many who followed in your footsteps since you joined to serve a nation at war, willingly coming forward to stand in the gap between the American people and any who would threaten them. Although commissioned in the waning days of the Second World War, you would soon be called upon to lead in the crucible of ground combat in Korea and Vietnam, and to stand guard against the threat of Communism on the front lines of the Cold War.

Your class served and led our Army and Nation with distinction, producing a Medal of Honor recipient, three West Point Distinguished Graduates, 52 general officers and even a United States Ambassador. As you return to your "Rockbound Highland Home" to celebrate your 75th class reunion, the entire West Point team joins me in welcoming you back and thanking you for all you have done – and continue to do – for West Point and our great Nation. You truly represent the true strength of the Long Gray Line: its resilience and timelessness. We are grateful for your many years of honorable and selfless service to our Army and our great Nation, as well as for your legacy of personal and professional excellence.

Thank you for gripping hands with so many generations of Army leaders of character. Furthermore, thank you for continuing to grip hands with today's Corps of Cadets. They stand on your shoulders and will carry your legacy forward to pass along to future generations.
